

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING
between
**THE OHIO STATE UNIVERSITY COLLEGE OF
PHARMACY, COLUMBUS, OHIO, U.S.A**
and
**CHINA MEDICAL UNIVERSITY COLLEGE OF PHARMACY,
TIACHUNG, TAIWAN**

In accordance with a mutual desire to promote further cooperation in higher education between the United States of America and Taiwan, China Medical University College of Pharmacy, Tiachung, Taiwan, and The Ohio State University on behalf of its College of Pharmacy, Columbus, Ohio, USA enter into this formal agreement for the purpose of educational and cultural exchange. The goals of the cooperating institutions are to foster advancement of pharmacy education, promote scientific research, and enhance understanding and collaboration between the faculties and students of the China Medical University College of Pharmacy, Tiachung, Taiwan, (hereinafter CMU-COP), and The Ohio State University College of Pharmacy (hereinafter OSU-COP), Columbus, Ohio, USA.

This Memorandum of Understanding builds on and is meant to replace previous existing arrangements between CMU-COP and OSU-COP with the intent of extending the existing relationship which was initiated in 2006.

Specifically, the institutions resolve to accomplish the following on a reciprocal basis:

1. Admit selected predoctoral students and fellows nominated by either institution into the graduate education program of the other for training and collaboration in research;
2. Place selected postdoctoral research fellows in the pharmaceutical sciences in laboratories within CMU-COP and OSU-COP and their affiliated institutions;
3. Offer exchange clerkships to senior pharmacy students;
4. Promote faculty exchanges, including opportunities for scholars and clinical specialists to undertake short-term visits for lectures, consultations, and to participate in colloquia and seminars;
5. Explore the feasibility of exchanging senior pharmacists and postdoctoral clinical fellows within graduate pharmacy education programs of CMU-COP and OSU-COP and their affiliated institutions;
6. Exchange information and plans for curriculum design and development with the objective of replicating models of pharmacy education that are transferable; and
7. Develop additional collaborative programs in the future.



It is understood that the details of joint activities, conditions for utilization of the results achieved, and arrangements for specific visits, exchanges, and all other forms of cooperation will be negotiated for each specific case. It is also understood that any financial arrangements will be negotiated in each specific case and will depend upon the availability of funds. Each party agrees to seek financial resources for supporting such exchanges and collaboration.

This agreement will be in force for a period of five (5) years from the latest date appearing below. It may be renewed for additional periods of five years if both institutions, acting independently, agree in writing to renew it at least six (6) months before it expires.


