

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (MOU)

between

School of Chinese Medicine, Faculty of Medicine The Chinese University of Hong Kong and





Article I. Parties and Purpose

The College of Chinese Medicine, China Medical University (CCM, CMU), located in Taichung, Taiwan and the School of Chinese Medicine, The Chinese University of Hong Kong (SCM, CUHK) located in Hong Kong SAR, China (each a "Party" and collectively, the "Parties") agree to renew this Memorandum of Understanding to continue to promote mutual interest in educational excellence, academic ties and research collaborations, as well as to deepen the understanding of the economic, cultural and social issues in both places.

Article II. Areas of Cooperation and Collaboration

The Parties agree to establish and conduct projects, programs and activities as deemed appropriate in one or more of the following general areas. Specific details of each will be defined by mutual agreement in writing as an Addendum. Potential areas of cooperation/collaboration include but are not limited to:

- 1. Collaborative educational programs and activities;
- 2. Conducting research and other scholarly activities in disciplines and on subjects of mutual interest and benefit;
- 3. Implementing faculty, staff and student interflow, training and related activities:
- 4. Carrying out planning and institutional development;
- 5. Preparing and submitting grant, contract and other proposals to obtain resources to support collaborative activities; and
- 6. Other activities as may be mutually agreed.

Article III. Implementation of Cooperative/Collaborative Projects, Programs and Activities

Specific details of any cooperative/collaborative activities to be conducted will be described and agreed upon in writing as an Addendum. The Addendum will include the specific activities to be conducted; responsibilities of the Parties; personnel who will participate; allocation of time and resources required; implementation procedures; and other details as necessary. The Parties agree that they will be free to participate in projects acting either individually or collectively.

Article IV. Cooperation with Third Parties

The Parties may identify other agencies or institutions for joint participation in mutually agreed projects and activities and will be defined in writing for mutual agreement. Either Party may individually execute cooperative and collaborative research, education and training, economic

development and other activities with other organizations independent of this MOU and of each other.

Article V. Support and Resources

This MOU does not obligate either Party to provide funds and/or other resources from its own or other sources unless agreed in writing through a separate Addendum. The Parties may jointly or individually seek funding and other support from third parties for the conduct of collaborative projects, programs and/or activities. Neither Party will accept any liability for accidents, injury or death occurring to students or faculty participants during the term of this MOU, nor any liability for debts or damages, including against loss or damage to any personal property, incurred by participants during the period of the MOU.

Article VI. Duration, Termination and Modification of Agreement

This MOU shall take effect from the date of the last signature for a period of five (5) years and may be modified by mutual written consent of the Parties. The MOU may be terminated by either institution provided that six (6) months written notice is given to the other Party. Activities that have commenced under this MOU at the time of termination shall not be affected and be allowed to continue until completion. Renewal of this MOU is contingent upon a review of activities between the Parties covered in this MOU. The Parties should endeavor to begin the review six (6) months before expiry of the MOU. The Parties should be satisfied with progress of the partnership and agree on a plan to enhance the partnership and program as necessary.
