




☆ Map of Yingcai Campus



ARC - Application & Extension

• ARC (Alien Resident Permit) – First time application

For international students, the ARC serves as their temporary ID card which can prove your resident status in Taiwan. It is a very important document and we advise you to take good care of it and <u>be aware of its expiry</u>!

Moreover, whether you have entered Taiwan with Resident Visa or obtained Resident Visa within Taiwan, please remember to apply for the ARC at your local office of National Immigration Agency, Ministry of Interior within 30 days upon arrival or of the issue of your resident visa.

Collection your new ARC card

- If you would like ISC personnel to collect your ARC card from NIA (we collect the card once a week or every other week), please choose "collect in person" and "Taichung First Service Center" when applying.
- If you prefer to collect the card by yourself, please send us the photo (front and back) of your card to update its validity in the CMU system after collection.

If you are not the person who signs the rental contract, you can also provide the utility bill that shows the address of your current residence as the proof of accommodation.

Important Reminder

Your ARC is closely related to your passport and National Health Insurance (NHI)

If your ARC expires, your NHI will be invalid.

If your passport expires, your ARC will be invalid.

Therefore, please make sure to pay for registration fee (you need to pay for the insurance fee even having tuition waiver) before the deadline of each semester (to apply for your certificate of enrollment) so that you can extend your ARC.


• ARC extension after graduation

The ARC could be extended to 1 year for twice and the total extension is up to 2 years.



Eligibility: Students must have resided in Taiwan for 6 consecutive months and can only leave Taiwan once within 30 days.

If you leave Taiwan, the eligibility will be postponed or canceled.


After ARC is issued, NHI administration/Immigration will check your departure/entry record. We will apply for your NHI card when you are eligible.

If you are not eligible to NHI after 6 months, you will continue to be covered by Shin Kong Life Insurance.

Work permit:

Can I work in Taiwan?

• Yes, if you have a valid work permit and conduct work less than 20 hours per week (weekly working hours are not limited to 20 hours during summer / winter vacation).

How can I apply for a work permit?

Scholarships

Scholarships from Taiwan government

Taiwan Scholarship from the Ministry of Education

Tuition waiver: Up to NT\$ 40,000 each semester

Monthly living allowance: NT\$ 15,000 or NT\$ 20,000.

A Taiwan Scholarship may be held for 4 years for undergraduate programs, 2 years for master's degree programs, and 4 years for doctorate programs.

Scholarship applications must be submitted to a Republic of China (ROC, Taiwan, NOT China, NOT PROC, People's Republic of China) overseas mission and applicants must apply <u>separately</u> to a university in Taiwan for admission.

Taiwan Scholarship from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs

Monthly stipend:

- 1. 1-year pre-degree of Language Enrichment Program: NT\$ 28,000
- 2. Degree programs: NT\$ 33,000.

Recipients are responsible for all expenses during their stay in Taiwan. MOFA will not provide any other subsidies. MOFA will, however, provide recipients with one-way, economy-class plane tickets for direct flights to and from Taiwan.

Scholarships from the Office of Global Affairs, CMU

CMU Admission Scholarship (Regulations applicable to students admitted after Fall, 2023)

Requirements	 Full-time students. Not received and are not currently receiving Taiwan Scholarships (provided either by the MOST, the MOFA or the MOE) or Indonesia RISTEKDIKTI Scholarship. Ph.D. students must submit a certificate of English proficiency with IELTS score 6.0 (or above), or equivalent level of English proficiency tests.
Content of the Scholarship	 Ph.D. 1. Tuition waiver for the 1st – 4th academic years 2. A monthly stipend of NT\$ 20,000 up for 11 months. Master Tuition waiver for the 1st academic year.

You will be automatically eligible if meeting the above requirements, there is no need to apply by yourself.

International Student Scholarship


The Graduate Student Assistantship Stipend can be applied once per semester. Please complete the application within the first two weeks of the semester. Applicants shall log in to the "Student Information System" and fill out the survey of student status each semester.

The Stipend will be issued after your student status has been verified by your advisor, the director of your department, and the Graduate Education Council.

Please note, the requirements and content of the scholarships/stipend are subject to updated announcements from the offices in charge.

Items to prepare for opening the bank account:

- 1. Original and copy of your passport;
- 2. Original and copy of your ARC;
- 3. Stamp of your Chinese name (if you have, should also be the same on your ARC); otherwise, you will be asked to sign instead;
- 4. NT1,000 to be saved into the newly opened account.

To update your bank account in CMU system, please take a photo of your passbook cover (the one having your account no.) to the Office of Global Affairs.

FAQ

Before Application

1. Is there any requirement for English Proficiency Test for Prospective Students? For Admission from Fall, 2024:

Applying for undergraduate programs:

Most of the courses are given in Chinese. The applicant must have the Chinese Proficiency Certificate of CEFR Level A2 (Waystage) or Level BI (Threshold) or above (or equivalent), the certificate should be within two years.

Applying for masters and doctoral programs:

Applicants must have an English proficiency certificate of CEFR Level B2 or above (or equivalent), such as TOEFL iBT 72, TOEFL ITP 543, IELTS 5.5, or other equivalent tests.

Notice: If you would like to apply for MOE or MOFA Taiwan Scholarships, English Proficiency Test is required for applying all English courses programs. And TOCFL (Test of Chinese as a Foreign Language) certificate is required for applying other programs (non-English programs).

2. What are the two "reference letters"?

Reference letters are the two letters made and signed by your previous supervisors/ academic teachers that can explain your research performance, academic works, and English Language Skills.

3. Can I apply for scholarships in Taiwan?

You should plan and apply for the MOE, and MOFA scholarship at the beginning of every year, at the same time you apply for CMU [Fall intake only]. Some countries have special scholarships for their students who plan to study in Taiwan. Otherwise, you will be automatically considered for CMU admission scholarship that is a dual support by university and advisor and depends upon the funding of your advisor and his / her lab.

4. Is it necessary to get the acceptance of professor for the admission in CMU?

Replied by Assistant Professor Peter Huang: We typically would not consider the students who have not received the Letter of Acceptances from CMU. In addition, please try to avoid sending spam email with the content like "I am interested in your research" without specific mentioning what you are interested in. Pls would consider that you just changed the title and sent it to multiple Pls for phishing. These things will decrease your chance to be accepted. Do ask for the funding situation of the professors, which directly relates to whether he/she can support your MS/PhD study.

Before Coming to Taiwan

5. What is the "financial statement" and how to get it?

Basically, two financial statements are requiring for the admission and VISA application. First statement needs to be submitted with the admission application, that can be received from your local bank and you can also download it from your app. Statement should contain your name and ID. Second statement is required during Visa process. The government of Taiwan needs this information to verify whether you have the basic financial support for your study in Taiwan.

6. How much money do we need in addition to Visa, Ticket Charges?

You would need at least NT\$ 50,000-100,000 (New Taiwan Dollar) for the initial survival before you get the first-month stipend from the university.

7. Is there any interview during Visa process?

It depends on the updated regulations of each representative offices.

8. Is Taiwan safe?

Yes, Taiwan is relatively safe. Based on the Safety Index by City 2021 from Numbeo, Taipei, Taiwan is the 3rd safest city (<u>https://www.numbeo.com/crime/rankings.jsp?title=2021&displayColumn=1</u>).

9. Does CMU provide a dormitory?

CMU provides a dormitory ONLY for undergraduate students. For postgraduate students, CMU does not provide a dormitory.

10. Do we need to arrange a room for ourselves?

Due to the increasing number of international students, it is recommended if you can find the possible living place before arriving. Please note that there are two major campuses, Shui-Nan main Campus and Yingcai Campus. It takes about 15 minutes for taking shuttle bus to travel between two campuses. ISC will assist if you have trouble in find a living place, but there is no guarantee of the room availability and if the room meets your requirement.

11. What is the average expenditure for renting a room?

Average rent of a room is about NT\$ 5,000-8000. Other extra fees may be charged (utility fees, internet charge, etc.)

12. Can I change the currency of my country to New Taiwan dollars in Taiwan?

Students should bring the money in USD and exchange some to New Taiwan dollars at the airport (please exchange enough cash at least for one-month rent & two-month deposit and the living cost for the first month if possible). In Taiwan, foreign currency can only be exchanged in banks.

13. Any mobile Apps that are necessary or helpful?

Install LINE (<u>https://line.me/</u>) and Google Translator (<u>https://translate.google.com/</u>) on your cell phone. Most of the people in Taiwan use LINE for the real-time message. *Installing google translator in mobile can help you to talk, written translation and even prompt image translation into English.

Your browser should have translator extension to assist you to read Chinese websites by auto translation.

14. How to apply for ARC?

ISC would guide you apply for ARC, and we highly recommend you apply for ARC by yourself as soon as you receive the contract of your living place to avoid the problems in **opening the bank account** and **stipend transaction**. It is online (<u>https://coa.immigration.gov.tw/coa-frontend/student/entry</u>) and very easy process you can consult with ISC and seniors during application process.

16. What is the expenditure of the month for food?

The average expenditure on food is NT\$ 5,000-7,000.

17. Is it allowed to work with Study legally? If yes then what kind of works do we get?

Very limiting works are legally allowed for a full-time student. International students who wish to work (as a TA, RA or tutor) or intern in Taiwan (either on campus or off campus) should apply and obtain the work permit before starting to work.

18. Is Halal food available in Taiwan?

Yes, there are many Hotel Halal food and you can buy Halal meat from Mosque, online, also from Px Mart and Costco.

19. What is the weather condition in Taiwan?

Weather not too cold not too hot. The temperature dropped to 9 °C degrees and highest up to 35 °C degrees in Taichung City.

Some typhoons (hurricanes) would hit Taiwan during summer months (mostly from July-September), in this case, please store some food in your place in advance and avoid going out during that time.

Earthquakes happen sometimes in Taiwan as well, the best way to protect yourself is to DROP down onto your hands and knees; COVER your head and neck (and your entire body if possible) underneath a sturdy table or desk. HOLD ON to your shelter (or to your head and neck) until the shaking stops.

20. How to get the accommodation/hostel/room at arrival and what are the ideal initial expenses?

Firstly, Taiwan has a language barrier more or less, but still you can try to find a suitable room (independent case) by the website and mobile app (*591.com). If you successfully contact to the landlords or agents, you can inform the International Student Center (ISC).

The cost of room lies between in the range of NT\$ 5,000~8,000 according to the location and facilities. The security deposit is two months' rent. So, you have to pay for three months' rent at the beginning, and electricity bill is separate. Electricity bill could be around NT\$ 500-700 per month (you have to pay once in two month) and some of the buildings also charge NT\$ 300-500 for Natural Gas, Water, elevator and maintenance charges.

You may consider using the renting platform in Taiwan (<u>https://www.591.com.tw/</u>). Using this platform to find the candidates of renting rooms will be easier than relying on the agency. However, the website is Chinese only and you need to verify the information carefully. Moreover, signing the contract usually need a person who can read Chinese.

21. What might be the food related issues?

Food consumption has cultural diversity that is different from country to country. This will not be a major issue if you can contact and consult with the seniors. There are some supermarkets, vegetables market and grocery stores e.g. IKEA, Safe and Save and Costco (for Grocery), Shuinan and Yingcai vegetable market, Indian stores for traditional spices, wheat and rice. You can buy HALAL meat from Taichung Mosque. Clothing (Net, Safe and Save) has very affordable prices. There are some basement shops near either Shuinan or Yincai campus that have relative cheap stationary stuff.

All in all, diverse items are available at very affordable prices. You just need to consult with seniors at the beginning to get a better suggestion by their comparative analysis and experience according to the national trends.

22. Is there any prayer room in the Campus? Or where should I get more information as a Muslim student in Taiwan?

So far there is only one prayer room in Shuinan Campus (located in B2 of Excellence Building), please talk to the Office of Global Affairs for the access to the room.

22. How to get the driver license in Taiwan?

The driver licenses for cars and for motorcycles are different in Taiwan. You should be able to apply for a driver license for motorcycle in the Motor Vehicles Office in Taichung. For students from certain countries, you may be able to swap foreign and international licenses for local licenses.

23. If the embassy issues me only Visitor VISA due to incomplete documents or other reasons, can I convert it into Resident VISA in Taiwan?

If there are no remarks on your VISA saying conversion in Taiwan is prohibited, then normally it is allowed. But the requirements in Taiwan may be stricter than in your home countries. Required documents are listed on the website (<u>https://www.boca.gov.tw/cp-166-283-c4da3-2.html</u>), you may also need:

- 1. Documents proving that your courses are taught in English (please ask from ISC).
- 2. English language certificate (not required if your native language is English).
- 3. Financial statement from a Taiwanese bank (should be at least NT\$ 100,000- 150,000). If you only have the one from your country and it is from the third degree of kinship (grandparents, parents and siblings), then an official document proving your relationship is also required. Moreover, you need to prove that you can withdraw money from that bank in Taiwan.

Entering with a Visitor VISA might also affect you in certain situations, for example: if you need to sign a contract for receiving monthly stipend (ARC would be required in most cases), then the long conversion time from Visitor VISA \rightarrow Resident VISA \rightarrow ARC might cause you lose stipends for a couple of months.
